Dear Parent/Carers

Welcome back for Term 4. This is a very busy term as you will notice on the term planner included in this newsletter. Subway lunch ordering is going well with many families taking the opportunity to order. From next week if you require Subway ordering envelopes it will be the family's responsibility to collect these from school. They will be available in your child's classroom or the front office from Monday 26th Oct. Thankyou to the P & C members who have organised for the Subway envelopes to go home for the first two weeks. The time you have spent counting out the envelopes and getting them to the classrooms twice a week has been appreciated.

Our annual book awards will be held during assembly time on the 8th December. Each classroom teacher from Kindergarten to Year 5 will be presenting an award to their classroom, one each for Academic Achievement, Citizenship and Endeavour. Thankyou to the P & C for funding these awards. Year 6 students will receive their awards at their graduation ceremony to be held on Tues 15th Dec. Pre-primary students have started their transition to Year 1 by playing this term in the 'big' school during recess and lunch breaks. Our 2016 Kindergarten students will begin their transition into Bungaree over the coming weeks. Year 6 students will be visiting the high school in their preparation for high school transition.

Our athletics carnival is scheduled for tomorrow Friday 23rd Oct. It is great to see so many families have their children ready for the carnival in their faction colours. The P & C are running a sausage sizzle meal deal. There will be some of these meals available on the day. Please order first up in the morning if you are yet to do so in order not to miss out. There will also be a coffee van on the oval during part of the morning if you wish to purchase hot drinks.

Please be mindful that the oval will be in use for the carnival on Friday and while there will be overflow parking available as usual, the area available for parking may be smaller. The works for the drainage and new concrete path in the parent car park will commence shortly. Thank you for your patience particularly with students getting on/off the buses while the safety fence is up.

The City of Rockingham has repaired the footpath outside the front of the school. A number of vehicles are choosing to park on the verge near this footpath. Sprinklers and the lawn area are being damaged by vehicles on the verge. Please be aware you may be fined by the City of Rockingham for illegal parking. 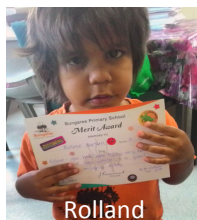

City of Rockingham Parking

Please be aware of the following offences under the City of Rockingham, Parking Local Laws 2004.

7.9 Stopping on verge -A person shall not stop a vehicle so that any portion of it is on a verge, unless you are the owner or occupier of the adjacent premises, or have authorisation from the occupier to stop on the verge.

4.1(3)(b) Parking contrary to signs or limitations -A person shall not park a vehicle in a parking area, except in accordance with both the signs associated with the parking area and the provisions of this local law. This includes parking in a designated staff parking area.

4.5(2)(a) Double parking -A person shall not park a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is between any

other stationary vehicles and the centre of the carriageway.

4.5(2)(f) Parking on footpath or pedestrian crossing -A person shall not park a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is on any footpath or pedestrian crossing.

7.15 Stopping in disabled parking area-A driver shall not stop in a parking area for people with disabilities unless the driver's vehicle displays an ACROD sticker.

Rangers are patrolling schools on a regular basis to assist in implementing the School Road Safety and Parking Awareness Program. Please ensure you abide by the parking signs and local laws surrounding your school.

Parking Infringements could be issued to offending vehicles.
